

Title I Parent and Family Engagement Policy

- Engage parents and families in an annual review of the Title I Program and use the results of the annual review to address any identified barriers to parental participation; to meet the needs of families to help their children learn, and to identify successful parent and family engagement strategies.
- Engage parents and families in the joint planning and development of the district's Title I plan through annual review meetings, schoolwide surveys, and representation on the Campus/Parent Advisory Board.
- Engage parents and families in developing, implementing, and reviewing School-Parent Compacts through annual review meetings, school-wide surveys, and representation on the Campus/Parent Advisory Board.
- Engage parents and families in planning and developing effective parent and family engagement activities through schoolwide surveys and representation on the Campus/Parent Advisory Board.
